

Provide coverage for your Idaho workers temporarily working in other states and avoid double premiums.

Idaho can request Extraterritorial coverage with any state that has reciprocity.

Neighboring Reciprocal States Include:

- Washington
- Oregon
- Montana
- Wyoming
- Nevada
- Utah



Quick Facts

- You must ensure you have coverage in every state where your employees work
- Agreements typically last for 6 months (varies by state)
- Not valid if your Idaho workers' comp is canceled
- Ensure workers meet laws of state they are in
- · Won't be backdated
- Can't request more than 2 weeks before work begins
- For permanent business locations in other states, SIF can coordinate coverage via our Other States Coverage program

How it Works

- Once you request coverage, the Idaho Industrial Commission (IIC) will send you a link for more information
- Complete the requested info. Once the IIC has reviewed the request, you will receive a certificate of approval (or information about your denial)
- Your certificate will be sent to SIF and the other state
- You must receive approval from the other state to have valid coverage

To Request Coverage

 - $\circ\,$ Name of your business
 - $\circ\,$ Current address and phone number
 - o State where your employees will be working
 - o Type of work to be performed
 - o Date you expect work to begin
